



Temporary Restaurants

ORS 624.010(6): “Temporary Restaurant” means any establishment operating temporarily in connection with any fair, carnival, circus or similar public gathering or entertainment, food product promotion or any other event where food is prepared or served for consumption by the public. Does not include school lunchroom providing food for community activities, private events or samples.

ORS 624.025(6) “Saturday Market” Provision: Temporary restaurants operating on an intermittent basis, in a group of six or more, at the same specific location two or more times within a 30-day period shall be issued one license for each 30-day period. Total annual fee cannot exceed annual restaurant license fee.

ORS 624.028(2): Allows a benevolent organization to organize one annual fundraising event and all temporary restaurants, whether for profit or not, are issued temporary benevolent restaurant licenses.

ORS 624.650: Mobile food units operating as temporary restaurants may only be charged a \$25 inspection fee.
